Applications for the SWSLHD Research Mentoring Program 2023 are now open!


This program aims to connect emerging researchers (mentees) to experienced mentors in a structured way, over a 6-month period (from Jun–Dec 2023). Mentoring is a mutual relationship that will help build professional networks, develop new skills and get first-hand information and support to build on, or expand on your research career, while giving an opportunity for mentors to grow and develop their leadership skills. ### **Ground-breaking Research**

Professor Anders Aneman and Dr Lucy Coupland are leaders of a new program of research looking at this potential intervention using Clotpro device. The team has developed a rapid pathway of detection, response assessment, and real-time monitoring of treatment response in patients for fibrinolysis resistance, a common condition in the critically ill patients which if untreated may lead to multi-organ failure and poor outcomes.

This pathway has multiple applications (e.g. stroke, post cardiac surgery, trauma and sepsis). The team has have undertaken extensive observational studies in several patient populations demonstrating the presence of fibrinolysis resistance. To read more click here.
