Ground-breaking new research - Improving Access to Cancer Clinical Trials and Diversity

Dr Abhijit Pal (SWSLHD) and Professor Frances Boyle (University of Sydney), with support of A/Professor Ben Smith have been working for over 2 years on a project to understand barriers and solutions to the recruitment of patients from ethnic backgrounds who are unable to speak English on to cancer clinical trials and the results have been published in <u>Journal of Oncology Practice</u>. They had surveyed 91 research professionals and found that lack of access to interpreters and insufficient time was a huge issue, and that routine measurement is not being conducted. 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
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Research Ethics and Governance Fees

Ministry of Health has recently issued an update to the Fee Schedule for Research Ethics and Governance Review of Clinical Trial Research (PD2023_015). This policy ensures uniformity in fee application across NSW Public Health Organisations. The revised fee schedule is mandatory and has been in effect from 1st September 2023, applying to both new and existing Clinical Trials submissions.
