Congratulations to Ingham Institute researchers on securing 2023 National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) Ideas Grant funding.



Dr Lucy Coupland was awarded \$1.01m for research into fibrinolysis (the degradation of the fibrin network of blood clots) in the critically ill, with a key focus on rapid detection, characterisation and treatment discovery.

A/Professor Tara Roberts was awarded \$1.58m on research into combining liquid biopsy and radiomics to provide personalised management of PSMA-lutetium-177 treatment for metastatic prostate cancer patients.

Research Focus: Enhancing Patient-Reported Experience measurements with ethnically diverse communities

Patient-reported experience measures (PREMs) are used to drive and evaluate unit and organisational-level healthcare improvement, but also at a population level, these measures can be key indicators of healthcare quality. Current evidence indicates that ethnically diverse communities frequently experience poorer care quality and outcomes, with PREMs data required from this population to direct service improvement efforts. This review synthesises evidence of the methods and approaches used to promote participation in PREMs among ethnically diverse populations.
