
Stay Safe:)

Patient Care Boards at the bedside have been a focus for Transforming Your Experience at Fairfield Hospital throughout 2019/2020. They are used as a tool to facilitate patient and carer engagement with staff and with their care and have rapidly become part of everyday practice for nurses and patients alike.

Mr Vincenzo Cavallaro and his wife (pictured below) have found the board useful. They report that the patient care boards help them to know who is looking after them, particularly as they were getting to know the nursing and allied health staff. They preferred that the staff complete the board for them. "We have a laugh with the nurses, especially when we are working out our goals for the day – we like to tick them off."

Mrs Cavallaro also told us that the mobility section was helpful as her husband had progressed off his walker while he was in hospital. She told us that it helped all the family to know what he can do. Mr Cavallaro was keen to use the board to thank one particular nurse for the care and attention she had given him. He enjoyed asking her to write in the comments box "My nurse is Fantastic!" And was keen to make sure that all staff had seen it.

Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Information

To help us keep you safe, we've limited our visitor numbers to one per person, per day.

You can have your visitor in the morning, between 10am and 11am and in the evening, between 5pm and 7pm.

Your visitor can come during both sessions, but it has to be the same person on the one day.

Who will be your nominated visitor at the hospital?

We need to take down their details in our visitor log.

We can only let your visitor in once they have been nominated.

We're doing this to protect all our patients and staff, following the cluster of COVID-19 cases in south western Sydney.

We are asking that you don't bring children to the hospital at this time.

The hospital has WiFi (if this is the case), so you can keep in contact with loved ones on electronic devices.

We understand this can be difficult, but we need to ensure all our patients and staff are safe. Thank you for your understanding.

Note:

- Women having babies are allowed one support person at any time of the day.
- Paediatric patients can have a parent or carer with them at any time
- Special exemptions can only be granted by the General Manager or their executive on-call after hours. This will only be considered in exceptional circumstances.
