

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Capacity Assessment Project (CAP)

NSW Health in partnership with Health Services is undertaking a Capacity Assessment Project (CAP) to assess organizational capacity and maturity across NSW Health Services.

The CAP will help to evaluate and understand how Health Services have adapted to the new operational and financial arrangements introduced since 2011, with the aim of building strong and effective governance at the local level to underpin a better health system in NSW. The CAP will identify our Health Service strengths, areas of innovation and best practice, as well as opportunities to service improvements across NSW.

An online self-assessment survey has been developed in consultation with Health Services and is the first phase assessment. Approximately 60-80 staff from our Health Service will be invited to participate in this survey.

The views and input of staff is critical to the assessment process.

The Survey should take approximately 40 minutes to complete and responses are anonymous. The survey is being conducted by independent market research company, Chantlink, and only aggregate information will be reported back to NSW Health.

The results of this survey will inform follow up discussions at site visits to be help in April or May 2015. A Health Service capacity report will then be produced.
