
Message From The GM

Fairfield Staff Changes

Community & School Participation


Fairfield Hospital prides itself on its strong Community engagement and this month is no exception.

Fairfield Hospital has had a focus on wound prevention and management throughout June. Activities included a trade display featuring the latest products and technologies used in the management of wounds. The companies represented were Acelity, Coloplast, ConvaTec, Hartmann, JB Medical, Molnlycke, Prius, Smith & Nephew and Urgo Medical. Attendees at the trade display had the opportunity to participate in a quiz. First prize was a basket of men's products won by Jeeba Sajith from MAU, and Hoyts tickets were won by Bernadette Sadsad from the Diabetes Service. A special thanks to Community Representative Charles Gream for donating the first prize. At Grand Rounds Presentations on

Workplace Giving Program

The South Western Sydney Local Health District (SWSLHD) together with Sydney Local Health District (SLHD) are engaged in a Workplace Giving Program. The Program invites staff to donate one dollar each week to ensure regular reliable donations can be made to charitable organisations committed to ongoing health related projects.

The Workplace Giving Program assisted the Barbara May Foundation to build a fully equipped 20 bed maternity Hospital in Ethiopia and donates \$17,000 per month to run the operations of the Hospital. The program also gives one off donations each year to the foundation for capital development. All administrative costs are covered by the Health Districts.

Currently there are approximately 11,000 staff members in total at SWSLHD. Approximately 2,200 employees in total are registered for the Workplace Giving Program (WGP)

from SWSLHD, a total of 18.15%.

SWSLHD would like to rejuvenate this project and reach 50% of staff contributing the WPG. This is a great cause and all donations are tax deductable. Why not start of the new financial year with commencing a contribution to this worthy cause.

Payment Summaries

Payment summaries will not be printed for any active employee, with employees able to receive these documents via email or through Employee Self Service (ESS). If an employee currently receives their payslips via email, this is where their payment summary will be sent and if an employee logs in ESS to view their payment summary, this is how they will view their payment summary. Payment summaries will be posted to employees who separated from NSW Health within the 2014/15 financial year

A printed payment summary will be provided for terminated assignments where an employee has transferred within NSW Health during 2014/15 financial year (these records will also be available within Employee Self Service if the employee holds an active assignments with NSW Health).
