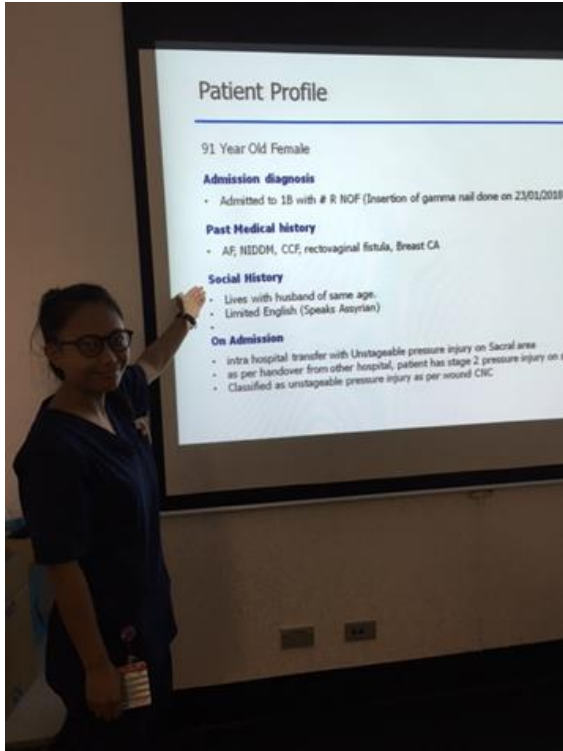
The network is looking to grow further and invites local residents to join who are:
