This year funds raised will go towards purchasing a Paediatric Emergency trolley valued at \$2700 and a Cosytherm infant warming system for Special Care Nursery valued at \$6500. Pharmalink


Pharmalink is an exciting initiative commenced February 2107 in the Medical Ward's in collaboration with ChemistWorks pharmacy at Stockland Mall, Wetherill Park. Patients who fit the discharge criteria are referred to this programme and once they attend the pharmacy the y are able to access other services which are available for health monitoring and promotion.

The aim of Pharmlink is to establish a link between Fairfield Hospital and a local pharmacy which is central within the community, close to Fairfield Hospital and able to offer a range of services, not only prescriptions and other medication advice.

Benefits for Fairfield Hospital include improved patient flow within the wards as patients are not waiting for medication to be delivered from pharmacy and patients are referred onto a service which can help them monitor their health and potentially prevent readmission. Patients who qualify: Those who take medication for chronic conditions, live locally at ChemistWorks, speak and understand English well (unfortunately there are no interpreter services at ChemistWorks at this stage) and the patient must be able to mobilise independently or have modified independence such as the use of a walking aid or wheelchairs.




Community Participation & Engagement
