

The Survey Team recognised the incredible work that is done at Fairfield and the incredible staff that work cohesively together to benefit our patients.

A full report will be provided in about six weeks, but the Survey Team were full of praise and have informed that Fairfield will not go down any ratings (as supplied by Fairfield) but rather the ratings will be elevated in numerous Standards and Criterion.

The biggest and best was saved to last — The Surveyors stated quiet clearly that in Standard 2 — Partnering with Consumers that they had not seen anything done so comprehensively and of that high standard in any other organisation that they had surveyed and indeed suggested to nominate this category in all the Health care awards categories as they

World Diabetes Day

World Diabetes Day (WDD) is celebrated every year on November 14 to mark the birthday of Fredrick Banting who, along with Charles Best first conceived the idea which led to the discovery of insulin in 1922. The celebration is to raise awareness of 366 million people worldwide with diagnosed diabetes. The Diabetes Clinic staff and Nursing Management at Fairfield Hospital wore the World Diabetes Association logo of the circles in the sky blue on this day to help raise awareness.

The World Diabetes Day campaign is led by the International Diabetes Federation (IDF) and more than 200 member associations, including Australian Diabetes Council. The campaign engages millions of people worldwide in diabetes advocacy and awareness. In line with the worldwide health awareness initiative for diabetes, the Diabetes Nurse Educators set up an information stand in the Cafeteria with the aim to help staff, families and carers understand Diabetes can be a costly complications but it can delayed or prevented.
