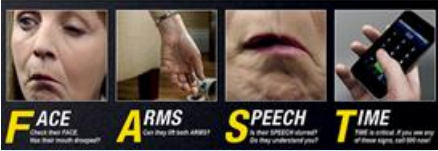
infection rate is the lowest in the District. A job well done by both our winners!

Time – Time is critical, if you see any of these signs, call 000 now!

Most treatments of stroke care are time sensitive so its important to think F.A.S.T , Act Fast..

Romy's prize is an all expense paid trip to Brisbane to attend the World Forum for Hospital Sterilisation Science (WFHSS) Congress in October 2016. Once there he will also compete in a Wrap Off with 2 other finalists both from Queensland.

Fairfield Hospital is proud of Romy's achievement and wishes him well in the final Wrap Race in Brisbane.
