

What to consider before deciding on a transport option:

Some transport options have eligibility criteria which need to be met before transport is granted. There are costs involved with some transport options for which the patient will be responsible.

With some transport options there can be a long wait at the Cancer Therapy Centre before being taken home.

Please bring any medications or other necessities you may require whilst waiting for transport, your appointment or treatment.

Liverpool Cancer Therapy Centre (LCTC) Patient Transport

LCTC Patient Transport provides transport to patients living in the Liverpool, Bankstown and Fairfield areas. Eligibility criteria applies to this transport. For further information, please talk to the staff from the Liverpool Cancer Therapy Centre. Please note, wait times to be taken home can range between 1 to 3 hours.

Bankstown / Canterbury Community Transport (BCCT)

BCCT provides accessible and affordable transport services to the elderly, people living with disability or disadvantage and their carers in the Bankstown-Canterbury area. Southern Highlands Community Transport (SHCT)

SHCT assists eligible patients who live in the Wingecarribee Shire. For information or eligibility criteria, how to access the services, fees or to make a booking, please call SHCT on 4872 3722 Monday to Friday, from 9:00am to 5:00pm or visit <https://shct.com.au/>

South West Community Transport (SWCT)

SWCT provides transport support to the elderly, eligible NDIS clients and people who are transport disadvantaged living within the Camden, Campbelltown, Wollondilly, Liverpool and Fairfield areas. Call 9426 8999 or visit <https://swct.com.au/> for information on eligibility criteria, registration process, bookings and fees.

Department of Veteran Affairs Transport

If you are a Veteran Affairs Gold or White card holder, you may be eligible to access transport assistance under the Repatriation Transport Scheme (RTS).

Patient Transport Service

Patient Transport Service (PTS) is a service for people who require non-urgent transport to or from a health facility.

To be eligible for PTS, you must be assessed by a doctor or registered nurse to be medically unsuitable to use community, public or private transport. These bookings can only be done by Liverpool CTC staff. There are no costs for pensioners or concession card holders.

Gandangara Transport

Gandangara Transport provides transport to Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander patients who are over 50 years of age and living in the Bankstown, Fairfield, Liverpool, Campbelltown and Camden areas. Patients who do not identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander may still use this service. You need to be over 65 years of age and must first register with My Aged Care.

There is a small fee for this service. Call Gandangara Transport on 9608 0968 to register or for more information.

Cancer Council Transport to Treatment Program

Transport to Treatment is a free service for people who cannot access community transport or have other transport barriers. Eligible patients can access Transport to Treatment through a referral from a healthcare professional.
