The Macarthur Cancer Therapy Patient Transport Service is available for cancer patients within the Camden/Campbelltown local area who require transport to the Macarthur Cancer Therapy Centre (MCTC). The bus is operated by the MCTC Driver and there is no medical equipment or medical staff on board.

Every working day the MCTC Driver will transport patients from their place of residence to the Macarthur Cancer Therapy Centre to attend treatment.

Assessment:

Patients requiring travel to and from the MCTC will be assessed by the MCTC Social Worker.

Patient Responsibility:

Patients are required to be ready for transport to the MCTC 1 (one) hour prior to the MCTC Driver's arrival at their place of residence. The MCTC Driver will contact the patient by phone upon arrival at their home to advise the patient that they have arrived. **Note:** The MCTC Driver will go to the patient's front door and knock, if there is no answer the Driver will then attempt to contact the patient via their phone/mobile phone number. If the patient does not answer the phone the

MCTC Driver will leave and drive to collect the next patient

Cancellation:

If, at any time during your treatment with the MCTC, you do not require transport on a particular day, please notify the MCTC Reception on phone number: **4634 4300 as soon as possible**

The Cancer Council Bus arrives at the Macarthur Cancer Therapy Centre at approximately 10.45am and leaves when all patients have completed their treatment.

Volunteer drivers are available to pick up patients from their place of residence and transport them to the nearest pick up point if they do not

have access to alternative travel arrangements.
