

Contacting Medical Staff

Patients are cared for by a team of doctors (Consultant, Registrar and Resident).

The Registrar is responsible for the day to day management with the consultant supervising overall patient care.

Consultant ward rounds times may vary but done each day. The Consultant and or registrar will re-view patients more often if clinical needed.

If you would like to talk to the medical team please let nursing staff or the ward clerk know. If the doctors are not available at that time, another time can be arranged, or you can leave your phone number and one of the doctors will call you.

It is helpful if there is a main 'spokesperson' to discuss progress with the doctors. It is generally not possible to have multiple meetings or return calls from many people.

Family conferences may be offered as an opportunity for many people to attend and discuss progress with all members of the team.

Campbelltown Oncology Ward

The Oncology Ward is situated on the 3rd floor in the Campbelltown Hospital. Entry to the Ward is via the main entrance, take the main staircase up to the ground floor. You then catch the lift to the 3rd floor.

The ward has 14 beds.

- ◆ 6 single rooms with their own ensuite bathroom.
Allocation of single rooms is decided primarily on clinical need
- ◆ 2 shared rooms
Where possible, shared rooms will consist of patients of the same gender
- ◆ Quiet room
- ◆ Recliner Chairs for patients

The Oncology Ward cares for patients who are immune-suppressed, require symptom control, pain management and palliation. The purpose of the ward is to provide a multidisciplinary, collaborative approach to patient care, aiming to provide the best possible outcomes for patients, relatives and staff.

The Oncology Multidisciplinary team meets twice a week (Tuesday & Thursday) to review the clinical progress of all patients on the ward.
