The Substance Use in **Pregnancy Service (SUPPS)**

Our goals

To promote opportunities for positive interventions that support and nurture the mother/baby, parent/baby relationship and promote a safe parenting model.

Our model is underpinned by a woman's own history of trauma and substance use which can have long term and profound effects.

What does the model involve?

Building Relationships/partnership/advocacy for women with substance use issues, reducing stigma and discrimination, planning for best outcomes

Providing appropriate drug and alcohol treatment.

How does the SUPPS service work?

Most referrals are received antenatally, continuity of care is provided through pregnancy, birth and up to 2 years.

Woman centered case management by experienced committed drug and alcohol midwife/ nurse consultants to help women parent safely.

Collaborative model with referral to targeted support services.

The SUPPS program is voluntary, women can choose to be part of the 2 year program.

If a women does not want to be part of the 2 year program, her care in pregnancy will be no different, the service will complete when mother and baby are discharged from hospital.

Referral criteria

- Current hazardous alcohol and /or current illicit drug use
- 2. Opiate treatment for chronic pain
- 3. Prescribed and/or non-prescribed codeine or benzodiazepines
- 4. Maternal benzodiazepines use that may put the infant at risk of withdrawal
- 5. Women on prescribed or non-prescribed opioid agonist treatment methadone or buprenorphine
- 6. History of illicit substance use and/or treatment within the last 12 months
- 7. History of hazardous alcohol use over the last 12 months
