

They perform circuit based exercises to improve strength, range of motion and function, and also give the patients a chance to discuss with a Physiotherapist in a one to one setting their

challenges and issues. One of the key components of successful rehabilitation post joint replacement surgery is working towards a goal (such as getting back to gardening, or being able to walk around at the shops). Patients are given individually structured home exercises to practice, to help them work towards their goal and get back to the activities they want to do!

Throughout the week commencing Monday 15 July 2019 Fairfield Hospital celebrated Wound Awareness Week with an array of activities to assist staff, patients and community to learn the latest on preventing and managing wounds.

Each day there were presentations covering pressure injuries, diabetic foot ulcers and general skin integrity which were presented by Nursing, Podiatry, Occupational Therapy and Dietetics. There was also the launch of the Wound Prevention and Management website (photo attached) which allows clinicians from the multidisciplinary team to access up to date information to assist in preventing and managing all types of wounds.

The key objectives for the campaign are:

- *Inform people about the links between gender-equitable parental social protection and breastfeeding
- *Anchor parent-friendly values and gender-equitable social norms at all levels to support breastfeeding
- *Engage with individuals and organisations for greater impact

Galvanise action on gender-equitable parental social protection to advance breastfeeding

So what is the empowering parents campaign all about?

"Globally more than 800 million women workers (41%) still do not have adequate maternity protection, and paternity leave is offered in 92 countries. Recent evidence from the Lancet (Medical Science Journal) confirms the importance of breastfeeding for survival, health and wellbeing of both mothers and children. Work is one key barrier to continued breastfeeding. Global breastfeeding rates have been stagnant partly due to lack of social protection and other support measures. Research shows that paid maternity leave policies could help reduce infant mortality by 13% for each additional month of maternity leave.. Several countries in, for example, Asia are working towards improved maternity leave provisions.." (World Alliance for Breastfeeding Action 2018).
