

Ward 1A celebrated with an afternoon tea for achieving over 50 days fall free. The initiative set by Ward 1A Acting NUM Kelwin Green was received well by staff who achieved 56 days of fall free in the Ward.

The goal for the Ward is to half the number of falls that occur in 2014. "I believe this is possible due to the excellent team we have," Kelwin said. Staff will try to achieve this by reviewing patient records, identifying risk patients and locating them together so that more supervision can be

provided for them.

Kelwin advised that patients at risk of falls include those who have had a change of medication, medical conditions such as a stroke, patients physical ability or even a the fact that patients are embarrassed to seek assistance. "This is a great example of Communication with Purpose (ComPurS) and hourly rounding." General Manager Arnold Tammekand said.
