Primary school students invited to Name the Crane

Primary school students across the Liverpool Local Government Area have the chance to get creative, win some great prizes and name the 40-metre tower crane that will help build the new \$50 million multi-storey car park at Liverpool Hospital.

The winning name will be displayed on a banner flown from the crane and all winners will be invited to attend an official crane naming ceremony with key project representatives.

Liverpool Hospital General Manager Karen McMenammin said she looked forward to seeing all the creative entries from the students.

“The arrival of the crane is an exciting milestone of the Liverpool Health and Academic Precinct project and will be a feature of the Liverpool skyline throughout construction of the car park,” Ms McMenammin said

“The competition is a fun way to involve younger members of the community in one of the biggest hospital infrastructure projects in the state.”

As part of the \$790 million Liverpool Hospital redevelopment, the seven-storey car park will provide more than 500 additional parking spaces for the campus.

The car park will help improve accessibility to health services for patients and their families.

To enter the competition, students need to come up with a name, share why they've chosen that name, colour in the crane on the entry form and submit via mail or in person.

Prizes include an iPad along with \$100 and \$50 EFTPOS gift cards, donated by project builders ADCO Constructions.
