- Kylie Stewart is a Senior Occupational Therapist and team leader for the Liverpool and Fairfield Mental Health Service. She has consulted across mental health services and is an avid promoter of occupational therapy and allied health in mental health and quality clinical care.
- Loren Johnson is the Occupational Therapy Student Unit Supervisor at Camden and Campbelltown Hospitals. She has designed and implemented different student models to develop the skills of emerging clinicians and produce high-quality care for patients.
- Associate Professor Grahame Simpson is a leader of research that aims to improve health outcomes and quality of life for people who have suffered traumatic brain injury (TBI) or spinal injury.
