Hindi is a language spoken in most states in northern and central India. It is an Indo-European language, of the Indo-Aryan subfamily. Hindi derives much of its formal and technical vocabulary from Sanskrit. Due to Muslim influence in Northern India, a large number of Persian, Arabic and Turkish words were adopted. There are approximately 1650 dialects spoken across India.

Hindi first started to be used in writing during the 4th century AD. It was originally written with the Brahmi script but since the 11th century AD it has been written with the Devanāgarī alphabet. The first printed book in Hindi was John Gilchrist's *Grammar of the Hindoostanee Language*, which was published in 1796.

Currently SSWAHS Health Care Interpreter Service employs 4 Hindi sessional interpreters.
